QUESTIONS & ANSWERS OCCIDENTALAVE.BIKE&PEDESTRIANIMPROVEMENTS

Q: What is the purpose of the project?

A: This initiative aims to enhance the overall accessibility and safety of the intersections at Ralston/Occidental and Chapin/Occidental, and traffic calming. The project will include traffic calming features such as speed cushions and bike sharrow markings along Occidental.

Q: Are we introducing new bike lanes?

A: No, Occidental is recommended as Class 3B neighborhood bike routes on the Burlingame Bike and Ped master plan. Therefore, we are only adding sharrow markings and signages.

Q: Are we taking away parking spaces?

A: Yes, some parking spaces near the intersections will have to be taken away in order to improve visibility and safety.

Q: How are we slowing down vehicle speed along Occidental?

A: Speed cushions are recommended.

Q: Does the Ralston median's orientation slow traffic enough as it comes down Ralston Ave?

A: The proposed median at Ralston and Occidental intersection provides safety to all modes of transportation by significantly reducing the crossing distance and facilitating slower vehicular speeds.

Q: Will a stop sign be placed at the El Camino Real end of Chapin, to slow traffic moving from El Camino to Occidental?

A: El Camino Real and Chapin is already a controlled intersection, no stop sign will be placed.

Q: Who is paying for the improvements?

A: The City received \$420,000 in grant funding through Measure A and Measure W, in addition, City is matching \$180,000 towards the project.

Q: What are the granite pathways for?

A: The pathway is designed for pedestrian crossing, it is still at a conceptual phase, more information will be provided as the information becomes available.

Q: Could we please have more information about how traffic is predicted to slow/flow?

A: Traffic calming is part of this project that can be achieved via the introduction of speed cushions along Occidental Ave.

Q: What is the proposed timeframe?

A: If the project is well received by the residents, provided all approvals are obtained in a timely manner, the construction can start as early as the fall 2024, and complete by the end of 2024.

Q: What can the residents do to help?

A: Please attend all public meetings, if possible, to provide your valuable feedback.
